Our June meeting's guest is reknowned engineer Frank Laico. Frank worked at CBS/Columbia Records between 1947 and 1982, at Liderkranz Hall, 799 Seventh Avenue, and their famed 30th street studio, a repurposed Greek Orthodox church building.

Frank Laico: "In those days (during the 40's), CBS made their own equipment. The mixing console had only six positions! So if you had a large orchestra, you'd have to be careful about how you balanced it. In the pop area, you had rhythm that had to be heard, so you'd use an RCA 44B or BX microphone with the bass player on one side, the guitar player on the other. Over the drum kit, you might use a single RCA 77D or - couldn't mike individual (elements of the setup) because the consoles couldn't do that. You'd use one or two mikes to pick up the brass and winds, and one for the strings. And of course, your vocalists would have their own microphone. If we had a vocal group, we couldn't mike them separately, so we'd put them behind the string section and mike them high." [1]


