Whitespaces and RF Spectrum News and Shure's Digital Wireless Microphone Systems

The landscape for the part of the RF spectrum that we depend on for wireless microphones and in-ear monitoring systems is in a constant state of flux. Reserved channels, the national database(s) have begun to go live, and fixed and portable whitespace devices are starting to be deployed. Can you stay on top of this ever-changing landscape? Shure can and does, since it is their vested interest.

Digital wireless microphones are newcomers to the landscape, and Shure now has two such systems, ULX-D and PGX-D. Both of these use digital audio for transport, and ULX-D also offers networkable control and monitoring of the receivers in a system. PGX-D is aimed at musicians, especially guitar players, since its digital transport allows a compander-free signal path. If you haven't given digital wireless much thought, this would be a good time to receive an overview of the topic and to explore two current products.

The Axient product, Shure's flagship, uses analog transport, and digital control. A separate digital control link between receiver and transmitter allows the receiver unprecedented control over transmitter parameters, including seamless channel switching in the event of interference. Like ULX-D, the receivers are all networked, and can be controlled from a single computer.
