Creating music for use in a film requires a unique mix of creativity, versatility, and musicality as well as an intimate knowledge of orchestration, harmony, counterpoint and composing a wide variety of musical styles and genres. Have you ever wondered what it takes to create and execute the score for a major motion picture?

Two time Emmy-Award winning composer/arranger Hummie Mann has scored feature and television projects for many of Hollywood's top directors including: Mel Brooks, Jonathan Kaplan, Norman Jewison, Peter Bogdanovich, Jim Abrahams, Rob Reiner, Simon Wincer and Joe Dante. Among his credits are the feature films *Thomas and the Magic Railroad*, the IMAX film *Cyberworld 3D*, *Robin Hood: Men in Tights*, *Year of the Comet*, *Falltime*, *Benefit of the Doubt*, *After the Rain* and the soon to be released *Wooly Boys* starring Peter Fonda and Kris Kristofferson. . Some of his credits for television include the mini-series *P.T. Barnum*, the miniseries remake of *In Cold Blood*, the HBO film *The Second Civil War*, the Showtime movie *Rescuers: Tales of Courage - Two Women*, the MTV biopic *Meatloaf: To Hell and Back* and the CBS movie ... *first do no harm* (starring Meryl Streep). He has also worked on many other films in a variety of capacities: he conducted the scores to *City Slickers* and *The Addams Family*, coproduced the scores to *Sleepless in Seattle* and *A Few Good Men* and orchestrated on many other films *including Sister Act*, *Misery* and *Dying Young*.
